- In the Musical Freestyle Test of Choice be sure to list level on entry and include copy of 58% or better technical test.
- Open show classes/divisions with less than 4 entries may be canceled or combined.
- Management will do its best to schedule specified ** Open classes before Championship classes where appropriate.

Qualifying For 2007 RMDS Championships Qualifying Dates: 10/01/06-9/30/07

- You need two qualifying scores, two different judges, and from two different shows, per level, see RMDS Standing Rules section XIV "Championship Show" paragraph B-4c for scores required.
 - Please Note: "These scores may be from any test at the specified level" (sec. XIV B-4a).
- You may attempt to earn your last qualifying score in the Open section of the Championship show (see sec. XIV B-1).
 - However, you MUST send in your championship entry form complete with entry in the Championship class you intend to qualify for on or before the Championship show closing date (see sec. XIV B-2).
- If you do *not* earn your final score in the Open section of the Championship show you will **NOT** get a refund for the RMDS Championship class that you were unable to qualify for (see sec. XIV B-3).
- Please note that RMDS Championship class rides DO count towards USDF year-end awards, not for USDF Regional Championship Qualifying. If you want these scores to count, you must be eligible for USDF Year End Awards (USDF Participating Membership and USDF Lifetime Horse Registration).
- RMDS Championship scores DO count towards RMDS 2007 Year End Awards (see sec. XIV A-2).

RMDS FUTURITY:

- Nominate your horse for the 2007 Futurity!
- No advance nominations are necessary, just mail in your completed nomination form with futurity fees along with your entry form and appropriate class and show entry fees for the 2 futurity classes.
- **Be sure to enter the two Futurity classes: classes 310 and 410**
- The futurity is open to all horses six years and younger who have not shown above First Level.
- Futurity Nominating Fee: \$35 per horse.
- Prize money will be awarded to Champion and Reserve on a 60/40 split.
- Run under Championship rules.
- No prior Futurity Champion may enter.

Management Rules and Procedures

- Classes designated RMDS Championship classes shall be open ONLY to individual horse/rider combinations meeting the criteria described in the RMDS Standing Rules section XIV B. See the Standing Rules and qualifying requirements in the current RMDS Omnibus.
- During the competition, the performance arenas will be open to hand walking only up to one half hour prior to the start of the first class. No horses will be allowed in the performance arenas during breaks. On Tuesday and Wednesday, priority will be given to arena setup and maintenance; however, schooling will be allowed on a limited basis.
- Both bridle numbers must be worn on each side of the horse when out of the stall.
- ALL dogs **must** be leashed and attached to a person or immovable object *at all times!* \$50 fine for all violations.
- Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. rulebook will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith. USEF rule 1402.1
- Open show entries accepted on first come first served basis, based on the postmark with dates on and between open and close dates. Mail only.
- Post entries accepted on first come first served basis with space available – including all Great American/USDF Regional Championship classes and all RMDS Championship classes.
- Wait list will be maintained through Tuesday 8pm
- Management reserves the right to:
 - Add or cancel judges
 - Combine, divide, limit or cancel classes
 - Refuse entries for cause.
 - Waive penalty fees
- **NO SMOKING IN BARNs.**
- Riders may compete in only ONE division, no cross entering divisions: You must choose either Open *or* Adult Amateur *or* Junior. Exception: you may cross enter into the GREAT AMERICAN/USDF Qualifying division.
- Schooling (out of competition) horses may be brought to the show but must be registered on an entry form, with signatures and appropriate fees. Areas where they may be ridden in will be restricted, and priority given to horses in competition. Check with the show office for details.
- All horses entered in competition must have a USDF HID or Lifetime registration. All riders and owners must have a USDF nonmember ID, Group membership, or Participating membership. All riders and owners must also have a USEF membership or pay appropriate nonmember fees (except Championship entries where full memberships/registrations are required).

ATTENTION COMPETITORS

Each competitor is responsible for supplying management with correct association numbers (USDF, United States Equestrian Federation) for horse, owner, rider, and trainer, before the day(s) of the competition.

The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted toward national awards.

TIMES

Provisional ride times will be mailed to riders if a SASE is included with your entry and they will be posted at www.rmids.org, the Region V website www.usdfregion5.org, and www.twowhitefeet.com. Official times will be posted at the show office by noon on Wednesday. **Please check for changes each show day – posted no later than one hour before first ride.**

REFUNDS

The office fee is non-refundable. Entries cancelled on or before the closing date will receive a refund of all fees except the office fee. No refunds if cancelled after the closing date unless ride is filled from waitlist. Waitlist maintained through Tuesday, September 25, 2007. No refunds of any kind for any reason including Acts of God from Wednesday 26 September through Sunday September 30, 2007.

IMPORTANT: All cancellations must be made in writing and mailed, faxed, or e-mailed to show secretary.

- Stalls are 12x12 permanent stalls with full sliding doors; stall fronts (including doors) are solid from midway down and bars from midway up.
- Bedding and feed can be purchased on the grounds; see hours of operation in show office.
- Stalls and Paddocks will be available at 12:00 noon on the Tuesday prior to show weekend.
- Priority will be given to stalls for horses before tack stalls if stabling fills.

AWARDS

- Open Show Classes: Ribbons through sixth place, first place prize.
- No awards or ribbons for qualifying divisions.
- Other fun & special awards may be awarded during the show, look in the show program for details.
- Breed associations and individuals are being contacted for breed awards as well, not all breeds may be represented. Send in a copy of your registration papers with entry to be eligible for these awards.
- Class #206 – Dover Adult Amateur Award – Second Level Test 2. For more information on the USDF/Dover Adult Amateur Medal Program, please go to <http://www.usdf.org/Programs/DoverAdultAmateurMedal.asp>.
- Awards for the Great American/USDF Regional Dressage Championships: Neck sashes and prize money to Champion and Reserve, Jacket and cooler (walking sheet) to Champion, prize yet to be determined to Reserve, ribbons to eighth place.
- Prize money for Great American/USDF Regional Championships will be paid directly by the USDF office to the recorded horse owner within 30 days of the last day of each Championship. Prize money will be divided equally for each class with 60% of amount per class to the Champion and 40% to the Reserve Champion. The amount of prize money to be awarded to each Champion is \$278 and Reserve Champion \$185 in all levels and divisions (Open, AA, and Jr/YR) of the 2007 Championship.
- DSM Semi-Final awards will include medals and other prizes supplied by the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. Champion and Reserve are eligible to compete in the nation finals.
- RMDS Champions awards a trophy and neck ribbon, Reserve Champions awards a neck ribbon, ribbons through eighth place. In case of a tie in RMDS Championship classes, the management will follow the tie-breaking policy for Great American/USDF Regional Championships classes.

GREAT AMERICAN/USDF REGIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP AWARDS CEREMONIES AND SCHEDULING

Riders placing in Great American/USDF Regional Championship classes must be present, mounted and in full riding attire for awards ceremonies. Failure, without prior permission of the competition manager, in consultation with the Technical Delegate, the Awards Coordinator, and the USDF representative, to be present and properly attired will eliminate the official score and placing and the next highest score will move up in placing. In the case of inclement weather, unmounted ceremonies may be held.

A tentative schedule for the Awards Ceremonies will be printed in the "Show Program" and the confirmed schedule will be posted in the show secretary's office by noon on the day prior to the beginning of the competition.

ARENAS

- Outdoor arenas have all weather sand mix footing.
- All tests will be ridden in an outdoor 20x60 arena.
- Warm-up arenas have comparable footing.
- NO LUNGEING in warmup arenas – use lungeing pads only.
- Coaching may be done from the outside of the arenas ONLY.
- Competition arenas will be open for schooling on set-up day, Tuesday and/or Wednesday (before show weekend) until posted close time in show office.

2007 Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships

In 2007, a single Regional Dressage Championship program organized by The United States Dressage Federation (USDF), licensed by United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (USEF), will be held in each of the nine USDF Regions. In addition, Alaska and Hawaii may each hold state championships. Please refer also to the comprehensive 2007 Regional Championship Program Rules which can be found on the USDF website or in the 2007 *USDF Directory*.

Membership/Registration Requirements for Qualifying & Championships:

Rider:

- Must be a USDF Participating* Member at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.
- Must be a USEF member (Junior Active, Senior Active, or Life) at the time the qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

Horse:

- Must be USDF Lifetime Registered at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships. Horse registration must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) of record. If a current lease recording is on file with USDF, the lessee is recognized as "owner" for all USDF membership requirements.
- Must be USEF (Annual or Lifetime) recorded at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships. Horse recording must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s) of record.
- Horse is not required to have breed registry papers.

Owner:

- Must be a USDF member (Participating* or Business) at the time the qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.
- Must be a USEF member (Junior Active, Senior Active, or Life) at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

*Participating Members are USDF members who join USDF directly. Group memberships are not acceptable for this program.

2007 Minimum Qualifying Scores

One set of nationally-standardized qualifying scores has been established for all USEF/USDF Regional Championships, for levels through Intermediate I, in three divisions: Open, Adult Amateur, and Junior/Young Rider. FEI Junior Rider and FEI Young Rider classes have only one respective division. Intermediate II, Grand Prix and freestyles have only Open divisions. The minimum percentages are as follows:

Great American/USDF Championship Eligibility:

1. Rider must be a United States citizen to compete in qualifying and championship classes.
2. Horse/rider combinations which have won a USEF/USDF Regional Championship may no longer compete in a USEF/USDF Regional Championship competition, in that division, at that level or a lower level (Grand Prix level excepted) if they received the minimum qualifying score for that division and level in the championship test.
3. A horse may not be entered in more than one USEF/USDF Regional Championship at a particular level in the same calendar year.
4. Riders are NOT required to be a resident of the region to compete in that region's championship. USDF will presume qualified horses will compete in the region in which the rider resides. Riders who wish to declare a region other than their region of residence must contact the USDF office by July 1 of the championship year.
5. A rider may not compete in more than one Regional Championship in the same calendar year.
6. In the event a competitor is unable to produce copies of the USDF membership and/or lifetime horse registration documents required to enter a qualifying class, a USDF membership/registration affidavit may be completed and filed with the competition secretary. A fee of \$5 is required for each affidavit filed. A copy of the affidavit and the \$5 must be submitted to USDF with the competition results. Copies of the required memberships and registrations MUST be included with Championship entry. Affidavits will not be accepted for USEF or USDF membership or horse recording verification purposes for entry in Championship classes (USEF DR127.2 -effective 3/1/04).
7. USEF Dressage Seat Medal Semi-Finals: In 2007, all junior riders through age 18 who have qualified at any level for the Regional Championships (excluding free style) are automatically eligible to compete in the Semi-Final Classes of the USEF Dressage Seat Medal Program. One Semi-Final class will be offered for Juniors, ages 13 and under, and a second Semi-Final class for riders 14 through 18 in each Great American/USDF Regional Championship. A Regional Champion and Reserve Champion for each age group will be named in each USDF Region. Protective headgear as described in the USEF Rule Book GR318 will be required for participation in these classes. For complete details of this program, see the USEF Rule Book, DR132, visit the Dressage page of the Federation website at www.usef.org, or contact the USEF Dressage Department at 859/258-2472.
8. Horses must be entered in qualifying and championship classes under their official recorded names and ownership as specified in USEF Rule Book GR812.4, and transfers of ownership or lease registrations must be completed in compliance with USEF rules prior to the competition in order for the horse to compete under the name of the new owner or lessee. (USEF DR127.2)

Great American/USDF Championship Rules

1. Riders must declare on the championship entry form for each level if the horse/rider combination is competing in the Open, Adult Amateur or Junior/Young Rider division and must meet minimum percentage requirements for the championship division entered.
2. Any horse entered in a USEF/USDF Regional Championship competition, even if entered at two levels, must be ridden by the same rider throughout the competition. Therefore, a horse can only be ridden by one rider.
3. Cross-entering Open/Adult Amateur divisions is NOT permitted at the same or at adjacent levels except at a level that does not offer an Adult Amateur division.
4. If a rider intends to enter a Regional Championship as an Adult Amateur, the rider must be an Adult by the current USEF definition and a current Amateur by the USEF definition. (refer to USEF GR105, GR808 and DR119.3)
5. If a rider intends to enter a championship as a Junior/Young Rider, the rider must be a Junior/Young Rider by the current USEF definition and must submit their birth date to USDF by July 1 of the championship year.
6. Photocopies of USDF/USEF membership cards and horse recording and registration certificates must accompany championship entry. (USDF Participating Membership for rider, USDF Participating or Business Member for owner, etc.)
7. Whips may not be carried in championship tests (Exception: Competitors riding sidesaddle may carry a whip no longer than 43.3 inches (110 cm), including lash, in USEF/USDF Championships.) An adjustable-length whip may not be carried by a mounted rider. (USEF DR121.9)
8. All championship tests must be ridden from memory. (USEF DR122.1)
9. The gate must be closed for every USEF/USDF Championship ride. (USEF DR126.6.a)
10. At no time during a USEF/USDF Regional Championship competition may any horse entered in that Championship competition be ridden by anyone other than the rider entered in the Championship competition on that horse (exception: grooms riding on loose rein). Further, any horse entered in a Championship competition, even entered at two levels, must be ridden by the same rider throughout competition. (USEF DR127.6) (NOTE: This applies throughout the entire competition, even after a horse has completed its Championship classes.)
11. In the event of a tie (equality of total points) for Champion and/or Reserve Champion in USEF/USDF Championships classes, the collective marks will determine first, second and/or third places; (i.e. when a tie for first place is broken by collective marks, tied competitors will receive first and second places, etc.). If collective marks are equal, the tie will remain unbroken (i.e. two first places will be awarded next third place, etc.). Ties (equality of total points) after second place will be broken by collective marks. Ties (equality of total points and collective marks) occurring in 3rd - 8th place will remain unbroken. In the case of a tie (equality of total points and collective marks) for Champion, prize money designated for Champion and Reserve Champion will be combined and divided equally between the two competitors.
12. Hors de Concours entries are not permitted in USEF/USDF Championship classes. (USEF DR119.5)
13. In a USEF/USDF Championship class, the horse must obtain 50 percent or better to be named Champion or Reserve Champion. (USEF DR123.4)
14. In USEF/USDF Championship classes, a steward must be appointed to check the saddlery, bits and spurs, on both sides of each horse immediately after it has completed its test and has left the arena. Any discrepancy to the saddlery rules will entail immediate elimination. (USEF DR126.10 - effective 3/1/04)
15. A Registered (R) Dressage Technical Delegate is required to officiate at USEF/USDF Championships. Technical Delegates for competitions offering qualifying and/or championship classes must investigate incidents of non-compliance and report violations to USEF. (USEF GR1108.1, GR1123.9 and DR127.3)
16. Entries in USEF/USDF Dressage championships classes are limited to competitors who have met the qualifications, membership, horse recording and registration requirements, and deadlines outlined in DR127 and published by USDF. Competitors who are properly qualified, whose completed entries are received by the Closing Date for a particular Regional Championship, and who have complied with all Championship rules may not be denied entry into the Regional Championship classes for which they have qualified. Only one class per division and/or level may be held to determine USEF/USDF Regional Champions. (USEF GR1509.2.d)
17. USEF/USDF Championships classes may not be split. (USEF DR126.1)
18. 18. Championship classes for juniors may only be held on weekends, including USEF Dressage Seat Medal Semi-Final classes.

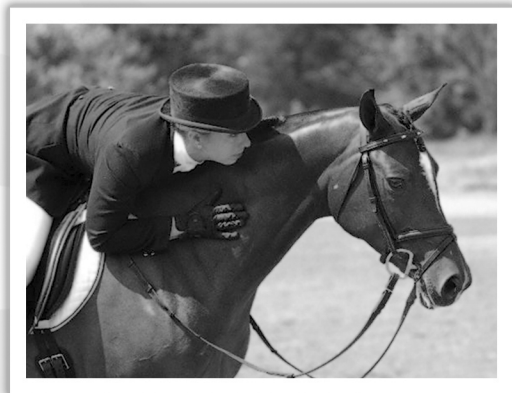

USDF Membership Benefits: USDF is dedicated to education, the recognition of achievement, and the promotion of the sport of dressage. For details on member benefits, including educational programs, awards, and other opportunities, refer to the USDF Directory or the USDF Web site at www.usdf.org. To participate in a USEF/USDF-recognized competition as an owner/lessee or rider, you must either be a USDF Group, Intercollegiate/Interscholastic, or Participating Member, or have a USDF Non-Member Identification Number. (Note: Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their Business membership.) Exception: Handler in DSHB classes or riders and owners competing in classes which are exempt from USDF HID requirements.



Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an *individual* directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. Participating memberships are available for 1-year (\$62), 5-years (\$250), or life (\$1,000). A Youth Participating Membership is available for members under 21 (as of the start of the current membership year) for \$35. A Participating Membership allows the member to compete at USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner for all Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Finals, and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The Group Membership year ends November 30. A Group Membership allows the member to compete at USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards program.

Intercollegiate/Interscholastic Membership (IM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Intercollegiate/Interscholastic Member Organization (IMO). The membership year is December 1 through November 30. An Intercollegiate/Interscholastic Membership allows the member to compete at USDF-recognized competitions, and participate in the USDF Rider Awards program.

Non-Member Identification Number: An individual with a Non-Member ID is not eligible for any USDF awards nor eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes, or Great American Insurance Group/USDFBC Finals, or receive other USDF membership benefits. PMs, GMs, or IMs do not need a Non-Member ID to compete. The Non-Member number is downloadable from the USDF Web site, or USDF will print and mail a card for a \$10 fee.

Business Membership: A membership issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. There are two types of Business Membership: Standard (\$100) or Full (\$250). The Full Business Membership offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. Business Memberships satisfy requirements of horse ownership only. The membership year is December 1 through November 30.

USDF Horse Membership Defined

*****Horses competing at USDF-recognized shows must have either a Horse Identification Number or a Lifetime Registration. Exception:** Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBC) at DSHB competitions, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (i.e. all Arabian, Friesian or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux, quadrille, or IPEC classes, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot and academy classes. For foreign owned horses competing in CDI class, USDF accepts copies of the horse identification pages from an FEI passport, or a completed HID application (with no fee requirements) in lieu of a USDF HID or Lifetime Registration number.

Horse Identification Number (HID): A one-time tracking number for horses (\$20). Scores earned by a horse with an HID will be recorded, but will NOT be counted towards USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes or Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Finals. An HID can be upgraded to a Lifetime Registration for a fee of \$45. If a horse is Lifetime Registered it does not need an HID. An HID does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration: A horse with a Lifetime Registration (\$65) is eligible for USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Finals and Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse is Lifetime Registered it does not need an HID. A Lifetime Registration does not need to be renewed.

The effective date of membership is the date the form and correct fees are received in the USDF office or, if applying at a competition, received by the competition secretary.
