ENTRIES:

To have a complete entry, copies of membership cards must be sent with entry: **See page C-12 in RMDS Omnibus for details.** Incomplete entries will be placed on a wait list. Use www.eqverification.org to print all of your USEF and USDF cards on one page! Freestyle entries send copy of the highest test of the level—min 58% to be eligible to enter. Current RMDS entry form must be used or entry will be rejected. SASE: Required Business size (4 1/2" by 9 1/2") envelope for confirmation mailing. Tentative ride times will be mailed separately. Official ride times will be posted Friday afternoon in the show office. Make checks payable to NCDA and mail to the Secretary.

A \$20.00 charge will be added for returned checks. All signatures must be original. Management reserves the right to combine/split or cancel classes, cancel or add judges as entries warrant, and refuse any entry. If using a permanent RMDS bridle tag number, you must list the number on entry form or you will be assigned a number. Riders may compete in only ONE division, no cross entering divisions except for the GAIG /USDF Qualifying division. Entries accepted on first come, first served basis for the levels offered based on postmark.

REFUNDS: Up to closing-all fees refunded. From day after closing to day prior to competition, class fees will be refunded only if ride(s) can be filled, stabling refunded if the stalls were not used. During competition days, no refunds including for Acts of God. The office fee is never refundable after closing.

AWARDS: Trophy and ribbons through 6th place in each division except “Q”. High point prize for each division (O, J/Y, AA) for National Levels (TR – 4) offered each day. One FEI high point prize per day. Ties will be broken by the collective marks. If identical collective marks, then ties will remain. The USDF/Dover Adult Amateur Medal will be awarded to the adult amateur riding at Second Level Test 3 with the highest score of at least 58% or better who is a USDF group or participating member. The American Trakehner Association Dressage High-Point Award Ribbon will be awarded to the highest percent riding test score achieved by an ATA registered horse at training or above in a USDF judged and recognized class. Freestyles classes are not eligible. Please send a copy of your horse’s ATA registration papers with your entry. Note: Anglo-Arab and Part-Trakehners are eligible if ATA registered. The AMHA Morgan High Point Award will be awarded for the highest scoring Morgan in individual open competitions regardless of the division the horse competes in. To compete for the award, please include a copy of your horse’s Morgan registration papers with your entry.

STABLING: On-site permanent deluxe covered stalls w/doors. Day stalls and tack stalls will be available. Refundable \$20 stall stripping deposit required on **all** stalls. Please use a separate check made out to NCDA for the stall strip deposit so that we may return your check to you. Shavings available for purchase on grounds. No bedding provided. Stabling available at noon on Friday.

ARENAS: Sand footing in competition and warm-up arenas. Show arena is indoors. A short 20x40 arena may be used for Training level tests 1 and 2. Standard sized arena for all other tests. Lunging pens available—no lunging in warm-up. Arenas open for schooling Friday afternoon/evening until show office closes at 6 p.m. Hand-walking around the outside of the competition arenas is allowed until ½ hour before competition starts in AM and at the close of competition each day. Arena setup and maintenance takes precedence over riding or hand-walking.

DIRECTIONS: From I-25, Exit 7, go east on state highway 212 (East College Drive) past US Hwy 85 to 1400 East College Drive. From I-80, Exit 364, go south on College Drive.

MANAGEMENT RULES AND PROCEDURES: **No Dogs allowed.** Concessions on grounds. Vet on call—info posted at show office. Farrier on grounds. Non-competing horses are allowed but must fill out entry form, enclose a Coggins, pay office fee and non-competing horse fee. The assigned bridle tag must be worn when horse is out of stall. Minors are required to have a valid driver’s license issued by their state of residence in order to operate a motorized vehicle on competition grounds. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.
